Working here at the Stillwaters office each week I hear this question quite often "I think I want to rent or maybe own my home, maybe." or "I know I don't want the hassle of owning but I do want my own place." To Rent or to Own – that is the question.

I ran across an article written a while back that I think gives a good framework for deciding the best direction. Jean Chatzky, in AARP.org writes about five questions to consider in making this decision.

- What costs more? Not only what costs more now but how are costs projected to rise? Will the percent of rising rent costs continue to outpace rising costs of owning a home each year.
- 2. What's your timetable? How long do you plan to be there. The shorter the timeframe the more it makes sense to rent.
- 3. **Are you moving somewhere new?** Renting initially in a new area or city often makes sense. Then once you learn the area you are ready to buy if you want.
- 4. **How is your cash flow?** The more unpredictable your income the better it is to rent. You can also manage buying a home with unpredictable income is you purchase less house than you can afford which gives added wiggle room on finances.
- 5. **Do you value freedom or control?** Renting leaves you free from repair and maintenance worries and buying gives you more control over colors, changes and improvements. You choose your comfort level.

the surviving veterans of D-Day. The museum plans to honor Parshall's wish and invite any living veterans who were there on June 6, 1944, whether they landed on the beaches, served on one of the ships, flew over the battlefield, or parachuted behind the enemy lines on D-Day.
