Here are some good conservation ideas at the following websites.

First, is a website to sign up for that allows you to opt out of phone books you don't use. There are three phone books delivered in our area and most of us use only one or none! Eliminating several phone books at once is as simple as clicking **HERE**. Just create an account and click on the local directories that you no longer wish to receive. This is a good way to eliminate unused phone books and foremost is a way to save a tree.

Second, a good way to remove your name from several national mailing lists at once is to sign up for the Direct Marketing Association's Mail Preference Service at by clicking **HERE**. This website provides instructions on how to register online or via U.S. mail. This service is only for national (not local) mail and only for residential, not business addresses. The service is good for five years.
