She uses a method called "Keep, Pass, and Toss" for sorting through belongings before a move. Since there is usually a lot of emotion in going through treasures, having a process to accomplish this tends to help. ×

To Get Started sort all items into these three categories.

Keep: Things that will be moved to your new home.

Pass: Things that will need to be given away, sold or donated.

Toss: Things that need to be discarded.

This is great advice for starting the moving and downsizing process and also for those times when you just need to clean out a closet! Having this process in



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mind this week has helped me clean out a storage closet at home. This closet tends to be where I put just about everything over time so it has been productive using the keep, pass and toss method!
